INTER-CLASS MEET ON DRIVING TRACK

**Postponed From Thursday,
Races Were Run Off
Yesterday Afternoon.**

**Sophomores Won the Silver
Trophy Cup With 63 Points
—Next Highest Class Was
Juniors, With But 27 Points.**

After being postponed from Thursday afternoon the Inter-Class track meet of the students of Bridgeton High School was held at the Bridgeton Driving Association's track yesterday afternoon.

Although late in the afternoon rain threatened, the day was an ideal one for this kind of sport and a fairly large audience filled the big grandstand, and plenty of school and class spirit was shown from the stand.

The meet was a most pronounced success both from attendance and the results of the contests as pulled off, some excellent times being registered.

A small fee had been charged at the gate which provided a number of pretty prizes, and a small balance which will be placed to the credit of the athletic association of the school.

The Sophomore Class proved the strongest in the number of points won, making a total of sixty-three points. Second honors were awarded the Junior Class with twenty-seven points, third to the Seniors with eighteen points and fourth to the Freshman Class, with three points. A large silver trophy cup was the class prize, which was presented to the Sophomores, the cup to be awarded each year to the class making the highest number of points.

Four individual prizes had been provided, the winners to be decided on the point system. John Archer of the class of 1913, proved to be the best all-around athlete of the day, taking first place in the high jump, shot-puts and pole vault and second place in the broad jump. For his excellent work, which gave him 18 points, he was awarded a beautiful silver trophy cup.

Winfield Fisher, class of 1914, with 16 points took second prize, a pair of gold cuff links. He finished first in the 100-yard dash and broad jump, second in pole vault, third in the high jump and fourth in the shot-put.

Arthur Garrison, class of 1914, received a gold scarf pin as the winner of third honors. Notwithstanding his recent ill-health he came in first in the half-mile run and second in the quarter-mile and mile runs. His number of points was 11.

Fourth prize, also gold scarf pin, was won by Kelso Elwell, class of 1914. He succeeded in landing first place in the two events in which he was entered, the 440-yard dash and the one-mile run.
